Food Safety Issues Heat Up in the U.S. and Abroad

January 30, 2009, Torrance, CA - Tainted food killed at least three people and sickened more than 1,300 others in the U.S. and Canada during the last two years.

The problem is not only the number of outbreaks: there's a wide variety of food types involved, such as spinach, peanut butter, and Veggie Booty (a vegetarian snack food), and scientists don't know how the food became tainted.

The U.S. government is stepping up its efforts to protect the public from tainted imports. The problems coming out of China, including foods contaminated with the industrial chemical melamine, have prompted the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to open three offices in China.

A report by the House Energy and Commerce Committee cited Japan's system for Chinese food exports as a possible model for U.S. importers.

The Japanese have long been known for their quality control. At Sun Chlorella Corporation of Japan, for example, there are strict sanitation and hygienic requirements for their entire operation. Each step of the process is checked by computers, technicians and inspectors.

The purity and processing quality is checked by spectrographic analysis and an autoclave sterilizer is used to ensure that no contamination can enter the production process. Then, the final packaging is air-tight to avoid moisture contamination.
